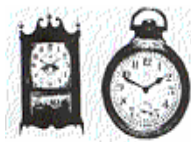

Bob Deaton

Our speaker for this month will be Bob Deaton, Board Chairman of the Catawba Valley Scottish Society (CVSS) near Charlotte, NC, who will be discussing colonial era citizenship and

patriot Major John Davidson's 1800's Aaron Willard Tall Case Clock. Assisting Bob will be Rick Dunnuck and Lee Yelvington, both of whom have first hand knowledge of this historic North Carolina heirloom.

Background: In 1995 CVSS accepted stewardship of the Rural Hill Plantation/Farm, which from the 1760's until 1989, had been the homestead of six generations of the family of Major John and Violet Wilson Davidson. Under a lease agreement with Mecklenburg County, NC, since 1995 the CVSS has been working to preserve Rural Hill Farm as a year-round historic attraction and Center for Scottish Heritage. In 2005, the CVSS first learned of the presence of an Aaron Willard Tall Case Clock at Rural Hill during the 1800's, and at that time decided to make an effort to return this rare piece of Davidson family memorabilia to its original homesite.

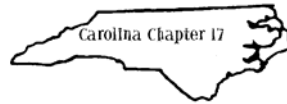
